MINUTES WELD COUNTY COUNCIL November 21, 2022

The Weld County Council met in regular session in full conformity with the Weld County Home Rule Charter at 6:30 p.m., Monday, November 21, 2022, at the Weld County Administration Building, 1150 0 Street, Greeley, CO.

ROLL CALL:

The meeting was called to order by President Nancy Teksten. Councilmembers Tonya L. Van Beber, James Welch and Rupert Parchment were present, constituting a quorum of members. Councilmember Cindy Beemer had an excused absence. Also present was Council Secretary Linda Kane.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

REVIEW PROGRAM:

Jason Maxey, Department of Oil and Gas Energy

Mr. Maxey has seven employees in his department. He said there's been a lot of changes in the industry overall in his two years as director.

The active well count in declining, but there's a lot more historical wells in the county. He said horizontal drilling has allowed energy companies to plug and abandon more wells.

As of November, there were 17,815 active wells in weld county. Roughly 88,443,675 barrels of oil were produced in the county with 649,598,748 mcf (thousands of cubic feet) of natural gas.

Since SB19-181 was passed and signed into law, the requirements and information needed to permit oil and gas locations have increased substantially. Production, however, has not declined significantly.



- Created by the Board of County Commissioners on July 8, 2019.
- Department officially opened August 5, 2019.
- Firmly established local control over mineral resources in unincorporated Weld County.
- Delegation of local control was included in SB19-181.
- Staffed with 7 employees who are responsible for permitting, regulating and enforcing Oil and Gas Locations as well as Location Assessment for Pipeline (LAP) permits.



Department Overview – 1041 WOGLA Permits

- 1041 Weld Oil & Gas Location Assessment code.
- Chapter 21, Article 5.
- Effective August 5, 2019.
- Revised code effective August 17, 2020.
- Second revision effective December 24, 2021.
- Comprehensive look at all proposed Oil and Gas Locations.
- One well or multi-well.
- Health, safety & welfare of the public & environment.
- Compatibility, cumulative impacts, siting analysis.
- Applications are reviewed by staff formal order given by Hearing Officer.




Department Overview – LAP Permits

- Chapter 21, Article 6.
- Formerly a Planning, USR permit.
- Planning Ord. 2018-05 effective February 1, 2019.
- OGED Ord. 2022-01 effective February 11, 2022.
- Comprehensive look at:
- Natural gas pipelines greater than 12".
- Other petroleum derivative pipelines greater than 13".
- Health, safety & welfare of the public & environment.
- Applications are reviewed by staff, administratively approved.






Weld County Active Status Wells

- Proximate Local Governments




