


# **Tobacco Use**

### **Key Findings**

- Reducing illness, disability and death related to tobacco use and secondhand smoke exposure is a goal of Healthy People 2020.
- The Community Health Survey asked residents whether they had used each tobacco product some days, every day, or not at all. Those who used a product some days or every day were considered current users of that product.



#### **Smoking by Income Category**



- Nearly two in ten people in Weld County used tobacco (19.4%).
- The adult smoking rate in Weld County (13.4%) was lower than the rate across Colorado (18%) and the U.S. (19%).
- Smoking was more prevalent among lower income residents: 38.1% of those whose household income was less than \$15,000 per year smoke cigarettes or ecigarettes.







## Weld County 2013 Community Health Survey

### **Key Findings**

- Countywide, 8% of residents believed secondhand tobacco smoke was a major problem, and 28% believe it was a minor problem.
- Residents of Greeley and Evans were the most concerned about secondhand smoke in their community: 13.8% believe it was a major problem, and 35.8% believe it was a minor problem.
- Among current cigarette users across Weld County, 45.4% had attempted to quit at least once, and 1 in 8 had attempted to quit 10 or more times (12.3%). However, only 8.8% of residents said they needed cessation services in the past year, and even fewer (1.4%) used cessation services during this time.
- Cigarette smoking has decreased in Weld County since the Federal tobacco tax was implemented in 2009. In 2007, 19.7% of residents smoked cigarettes; in 2010 and 2013, only about 13% of residents smoke cigarettes.
- The percent of residents who chew tobacco has remained about the same (approximately 5%) since 2007.






## Weld County 2013 Community Health Survey

### About the Survey

#### **Description of Responders**







#### **The Survey Explained**

- In order to periodically assess the health status of county residents, between October 15, 2013 and February 14, 2014, Weld County Department of Public Health & Environment contacted 7,502 households by mail requesting an adult to complete the 65-item survey or complete it online.
- Question topics included health, health care access and insurance, health conditions and lifestyle habits, preventive screenings, environmental issues, community concerns and needs, demographics, and the 2013 Flood Disaster.
- Households were selected randomly by first dividing the mailing list into four regions (see map below) and two household types. The list was certified by the post office but did not contain residents' names.
- After multiple contacts, 2,082 community residents returned usable surveys for a 28 percent response rate. The results are representative of the population within a ±5.0 percent margin of error.
