A motion was made by Lonnie Ford for approval of the biosolid new permit of Twin Peaks Waste and Disposal LLC. Joyce Smock seconded the motion, and the motion was carried unanimously.

PRESENTATIONS: Cassie Theisen, Environmental Health Specialist, Weld County Department of Public Health and Environment. Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program
Lead can negatively affect virtually every system of the body. Effects are more impactful for young children who are rapidly developing. Approximately one-third of the world's children are estimated to be impacted by lead.

Program Responsibilities:

Education/prevention – blood lead testing by appointment and at events, education and outreach at community events and with the mobile unit and provide guest lectures and trainings to partner agencies, university classes and medical providers.

Case Management – Initial test results of 3.5, result is entered into EpiTrax (Colorado reportable condition database), Weld County contacts family and provider to recommend confirmatory test, confirmatory test is elevated, Weld County conducts surveillance questionnaire and offers free inspection.

Investigation - for Medicaid-eligible children they're required to receive a blood lead test at 12 and 24 months, or anytime before 72 months with no record of previous test, for all other children a lead risk questionnaire is strongly recommended, resulting in a blood test if "yes" is answered to any question.

The inspection process consists of surveillance interviews with parents to discuss: the age and condition of home, renovation history, etc. occupations/hobbies of residents, knowledge of blood lead testing of siblings or other family members, where children spend time, commonly used cookware, spices, medicines etc. toys, jewelry, children's items; review recent recalls with parents. Onsite inspection of the home consists of immediate environmental sampling with X-Ray fluorescence analyzer (XRF) of painted surfaces toys, jewelry, etc. samples are collected and sent to an external laboratory sample of water from kitchen faucet, dust wipes on horizontal surfaces, soil samples from bare soil or play areas, and spices or folk remedies. Samples results are analyzed and compared to hazard standards, the report is compiled and sent to parent/guardian and property owner, if different.

Some of the exposure sources are paint, dust, soil and water, toys, cookware, spices, jewelry, folk remedies are some of the consumer products also lead-acid batteries, lead soldering, stained glass, sanding of lead-based paint occupations and hobbies.
