THE POSITION

The Chief Financial Officer (CFO) / Director of Finance is responsible for the overall financial management of Weld County. This role provides strategic leadership and hands-on oversight of the County's financial planning, reporting, and operations. The CFO will manage budgets, cash flows, investments, debt, and accounting functions, while ensuring compliance with applicable laws, policies, and GAAP standards. The CFO reports to the Weld County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC). This position serves as a key advisor to the Board of County Commissioners, Elected Officials, and Department Heads, providing clear and accurate financial analysis to support informed decision-making. In addition, the CFO oversees related functions including accounting, purchasing, treasury and tax collection, retirement plans, CDBG and other general services as assigned. This role requires a collaborative leader with both technical expertise and strong interpersonal skills to guide financial strategy, manage staff, and maintain Weld County's reputation for sound fiscal stewardship.



The benefits of working for Weld County extend far beyond simply earning a paycheck. We provide two medical plans to help your family stay on-top of your health and preventative care for everyday aches and pains, to dental checkups and procedures to vision needs. Choose from two Aetna Medical Plans - a Standard PPO (Preferred Provider Organization) or a High Deductible PPO with a Health Savings Account (HSA) funded by Weld County at \$1,000 annually for yourself and covered dependents and is pro-rated depending on benefit effective date. Our dental plan is offered through Ameritas. When you need vision care, turn to our Ameritas (Vision Service Plan). All of the medical plans we offer employees ensure financial flexibility, so you don't have to worry about the health needs of you and your family.

At Weld County, we have a fully-funded retirement plan that all employees participate in. In addition to that plan, Weld County offers both Traditional and Roth 401(k) and 457 savings plans to aid you in meeting your retirement goals.

When you work for Weld County, you have access to benefits beyond medical plans, life insurance, retirement packages and paid time off. Employees looking to extend their education and job-related skill sets can receive a tuition reimbursement of \$300 per semester, up to \$900 annually. The county also offers discounts on various items such as cell phones, computers and more.
